## **January 12 & 13 Flat Plane Carving with Carlan Honaker.**

Carlan has been woodcarving for over 50 years and has been teaching at nationally known seminars for the past 30 years. He has his own studio and offers private lessons. **\$100 (blank included)**

## **February 3-4 Incised Carving with Warren Raucher.**

Warren is a well-know woodcarver as a chip carver and in positive imaging. He has won many awards for his art work. **\$110 plus the blank.**

## **March 15 & 16 Charley Phillips.**

Charlie is recognized for her delicate floral carving and female caricatures. A decorative painter for many years, she turned to woodcarving for a new challenge. Her unique style and original designs have won many awards. **\$110 plus the blank.**

## **April 14 & 15 Pyrography with Jo Schwartz.**

Jo is a self-taught burner who specializes in human and animal portraits. She has an art gallery in Abilene – “Burning Tree Art”, and has been teaching Pyrography for several years. **Cost \$170 plus the blank.**

## **May 4-6 Relief Carving - John Engler.**

John is very active in teaching relief carving and watercolor painting throughout the U. S. as well as operating the John Lee Engler and Associates Design Studio. He specializes in medium relief woodcarving and finishing the works in a spectacular use of watercolors (painting will not be included in this seminar). **Cost \$165 plus the blank.**

## **June 8-10 Bark Houses with Ken Armsbury.**

Ken has been a carving instructor for many years. He has taught at numerous workshops and seminars, including the annual Doane Experience at Doane College. **\$145 plus the blank.**

## **August 4 & 5 Stylized with Sue Bergman.**

Sue is a member of KVV and is an accomplished carver in many different styles. **\$80 plus the blank.**

## **September 14-16 Western Wildlife—Debbie Edwards.**

Debbie began carving in wood in 1990 after receiving a small set of woodcarving tools for Christmas. Specializing in realistic wildlife, she began teaching seminar classes in 1994 and has taught classes throughout the U. S. and Canada. Project TBA. **Cost \$190 plus the blank.**

## **November 15 & 16 Painting with John Engler.**

John teaches watercolor painting for woodcarving that produces a unique finish for carvings. \$65 per day.
