In the U.S. the American National Standards Institute establishes standards for cut resistance and for gloves manufactured in the U.S., inclusion of the rating on the gloves is voluntary. In Europe the standards are set by the European Committee for Standardization and every glove made in Europe must be stamped with the ratings for that glove. If you haven't read the article yet, you should. If you don't get the magazine as a subscriber you might pick up a copy at your local bookstore or try to borrow a copy from someone. Very useful safety information.

issue of the British carving magazine, *Wood Carving*, has an article with a brief history of Thomas Chippendale and the furniture he is famous for producing. This year marks the 300 anniversary of Chippendale's birth. There is also a Chippendale style carving project in this issue.
