John and Mary Jane Ritchie were abolitionists in early Kansas. They built the house at 1116 SE Madison in 1856. It was a station on the Underground Railroad and is believed to be Topeka's oldest home. On July 16, the Shawnee County Historical Society will be celebrating the 200 anniversary of the birth of Mr. Ritchie. KVW is honored to have been invited to do demonstration carving during the celebration. We will need 2-3 volunteers to carve in 2 ½ hour shifts for the afternoon. We will be outside but will have shade.
