Membership: 18 paid members. Linda Benson prepares our membership list and will be in charge of membership since she is already doing most of it. Please pay your membership fee of \$20.00 for a family and come enjoy the happy group of woodcarvers. Some days we are quiet, others we are noisy. Help us our—we would love to see your happy faces with ours. <u>PLEASE PAY YOUR 2025 DUES</u> and come to the meetings on the 2nd Saturday of the month at 9:00 A.M. in the IBEW hall.

John Reynolds took pictures of them and will have them ready for our selection next meeting. We purchased wood at the show for ornaments and John agreed to cut them out when we decide on what we want.
